RED BULL SOLDIERS HAVE RETURNED FROM KUWAIT

More than 2,600 soldiers of the 1st Brigade Combat Team, 34th Infantry Division (1/34th BCT, Minnesota National Guard have returned home to their duty stations in Minnesota from their Kuwait deployment. The last of the soldiers returned in May. The commander of the 1/34th BCT is Col. Eric D. Kerska, from Rochester, MN. Silver Star for Battle of Do Ab

A Washington National Guardsman, who was working with the HHC, 1-133rd Infantry Recon element, helped repel a massive ambush by more than 200 Taliban insurgents in a 13-hour battle last year has received a Silver Star for his heroism.

Technical Sgt. Tavis Delaney's honor represents the third Silver Star for the Washington National Guard to emerge from the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. Delaney received his medal in a ceremony on Sunday, May 6.

He distinguished himself by putting himself in mortal danger to call in close air strikes against Taliban fighters who held the high ground in an ambush against a U.S. patrol on May 25, 2011 near the village of Do Ab in Nuristan Province.

"His gallantry under fire saved the lives of more than 64 U.S. soldiers and coalition forces and contributed to the destruction of more than 200 Taliban insurgents," the commendation reads. For seven intense hours, the battle that should have resulted in multiple U.S. and Afghan army casualties did not. In that time, Delaney "bravely stood upright" as bullets and rockets rained down on coalition positions so he could establish communications with aircraft overhead and call in the coordinates of enemy positions.

It took 13 hours for coalition aircraft to run down the Taliban forces aligned against the American and Afghan troops who entered Do Ab that day.

"They owned the high ground," Delaney told Air Force Times in an interview. "They had fire superiority. They had hundreds of people. And we killed almost all of them and didn't lose a single American in seven hours of battle. It was seven hours of full-blown, slugfest, back-and-forth, rounds-smacking-right-over-your-head battle."

Red Bull Awarded Bronze Star For Actions in Afghanistan

SGT. Jeffery J. Hall, 25, was awarded the Bronze Star for Valor for his actions during combat operations in Kapisa Province, Afghanistan on April 23, 2011 as a member of Troop A, 1st Squadron, 113th Cavalry. SGT Hall is a former Carroll resident currently assigned to the 294th Medical Company.

SGT. Hall distinguished himself during a during rescue operation of a U.S. Army OH-58 helicopter crew who were injured when their aircraft made a hard landing in Alah Say, Kapisa Province, Afghanistan. Hall responded to the scene as a member of a Quick Reaction Force ("QRF") that came under fire from enemy forces at the crash site. Staff SGT. James Justice of Grimes, lowa was killed in the operation, and SPC. Zachary Durham of Des Moines, lowa was seriously wounded during the mission.

SGT. Hall, is a five-year veteran of the Iowa National Guard, and works as an emergency room technician at Des Moines' Methodist Hospital. Troop A, 1st Squadron, 113th Cavalry from Johnston, Iowa is part of the 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 34th Infantry Division which deployed approximately 2,900 Soldiers to Afghanistan in 2010-11.

Air Force Capt. Elliot Milliken, an HH-60G Pave Hawk helicopter pilot, was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross as part of the operation. Milliken was co-pilot of "Pedro 83," one of two Pave Hawks dispatched on April 23, 2011, to rescue a crashed Army helicopter crew. His helicopter endured intense enemy ground fire, eventually rescuing an injured pilot, recovered the body of the second pilot, and retrieving a wounded soldier.

Notice: CW4 (Ret) Janis "John" Sunins, past Vice President and Board member of the Assn., died from esophageal cancer on April 7th in Des Moines. Janis, an immigrant from Latvia, served 37+ years in the Iowa Army National Guard and was buried at the Iowa Veterans Cemetery at Van Meter, IA.

All Soldiers Like Puppies

SFC Taylor Green of Troop B, 113th Cavalry, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, who served in Afghanistan from November 2010 to July 2011, is show playing with a stray young pup at Dandar Patrol Base, Afghanistan. SFC Green has served 16 years in the U.S. Army National Guard and works full time as a Readiness NCO in Troop B, 113th Cav.

SFC Green had served his first combat tour in Iraq, with the 194th LRSD, in 2004 thru 2005. According to SFC Green, "There were lots of dogs at the Patrol Base and they were always looking for something to eat. The dogs played a huge role at the Patrol Base, not only for security but the morale of the Soldiers. The Soldiers really became attached to these dogs, as it was a little reminder of home. Just like home, these dogs were always happy to see us when we returned to the base. With their tail wagging, they would sniff us and look us over as to check to see if we were all OK. Some guys even had their families send flea collars and dog treats to help care for the neglected pups. It was always a great time to sit down and pet and play with the little pups."

Vehicle Patrol Base Dandar was a small "temporary" base in Koh-e Safi district of Parwan Province. The base was initially an old civilian market that was built by a past Provincial Reconstruction Team years before we got there. It never got much use from the Afghans in the area, so the 86th IBCT, VT Army National Guard, that we replaced, repurposed the building as a vehicle patrol base. The structure was essentially a bunch of small garages build up in a Ushape. The garages served as temporary living quarters for the troops that stayed out at the base. The base had an Afghan National Police Station right next door, so the troop would work with the ANP officers and set up training events with them.

135th Infantry Regiment (First Minnesota) (As of Published Date 1953)

NG (Minn) (47th Inf Div)

Lineage

1st Regiment, Minnesota Volunteer Infantry, organized 27 April 1861 at Fort Snelling, Minn. (Company A, Pioneer Guards, organized 17 April 1856 at St. Paul.) Mustered into Federal service 29 April 1861 for three years. Reorganized April 1864 as 1st Battalion, Minnesota Volunteer Infantry. Expanded and redesignated 1st Regiment, Minnesota Volunteer Infantry, 23 February 1865. Mustered out of Federal service 14 July 1865 at Jeffersonville, Ind.

Reorganized 1870 from regimental veteran association as 1st Regiment, Minnesota Enrolled Militia. (Active or volunteer element of Minnesota Enrolled Militia redesignated Minnesota National Guard by Act of Legislature 1 March 1871.) (Regimental organization remained inactive after about 1875, except for St. Paul Light Infantry active 1875-1879.)

Reorganized 1880 as 1st Battalion, M.N.G., to embrace following independent volunteer companies in St. Paul-Minneapolis area: Minneapolis Light Infantry, organized 1879, as Company A; Minneapolis Zouave Corps, organized 1879, as Company B; St. Paul Guards, organized 1879 as Company C; Allen Light Guards, organized 1879 in St. Paul, as Company D. Expanded and redesignated 1883 as 1st Infantry Regiment, M.N.G., with companies as follows: Co A, Minneapolis; Co B, Minneapolis; Co C, St. Paul; Co D, St. Paul; Co E, St. Paul; Co F, Fergus Falls; Co G, Red Wing; Co H, Litchfield; Co I, Minneapolis; Co K, Stillwater. Redesignated 13th Infantry Regiment, Minnesota Volunteers, 4 May 1898 and mustered into Federal service 7 May 1898 at Camp Ramsey, Minn.; mustered out 3 October 1899 at San Francisco, Calif. Reorganized as 1st Infantry Regiment, M.N.G., 27 March 1900.

Mustered into Federal service 30 June 1916 at Fort Snelling, Minn., for Mexican Border; mustered out 14 March 1917 at Fort Snelling. Called into Federal service 25 March 1917 and mustered in 26 March-7 April 1917; drafted in 5 August 1917. Redesignated 135th Infantry Regiment, 34th Division, 1 October 1917. Demobilized 18 February 1919 at Camp Grant, Ill. (34th Division demobilized 18 February 1919 at Camp Grant, Ill.; reorganized about 1922.) Reorganized as 1st Infantry Regiment, M.N.G., 31 January 1920. Redesignated 135th Infantry Regiment, 34th Division, 21 November 1921.

Inducted into Federal service 10 February 1941 at Minneapolis. Inactivated 3 November 1945 at Camp Patrick Henry, Va after WWII. Relieved from assignment to 34th Infantry Division and assigned to 47th Infantry Division 19 June 1946. Reorganized, less former companies of 3rd Battalion with Headquarters Federally recognized 23 September 1946 at Mankato.

It was reorganized (less former 3rd Battalion) and Federally recognized on 23 September 1946 with Headquarters at Mankato, Minnesota. The former 3rd Battalion, 135th Infantry thereafter had a separate lineage. It was ordered into active Federal service on 16 January 1951 at home stations. The 135th Infantry was organized and was Federally recognized on 16 January 1953 with Headquarters at Mankato, Minnesota. It was released on 2 December 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control. Federal recognition was concurrently withdrawn from the 135th Infantry.

The unit was reorganized on 22 February 1959 as a parent regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System to consist of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Battle Groups, elements of the 47th Infantry Division. On it was reorganized on 1 April 1963 to consist of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Battalions, elements of the 47th Infantry Division. On 1 February 1968 it was reorganized again to consist of the 1st and 2nd Battalions, elements of the 47th Infantry Division. It was withdrawn on 30 November 1988 from the Combat Arms Regimental System and reorganized under the United States Army Regimental System. 1st and 2nd Battalions, 135th Infantry were relieved on 10 February 1991 from assignment to the 47th Infantry Division and assigned to the 34th Infantry Division. The 135th Infantry was reorganized on 1 September 1992 to consist of the 2nd Battalion, an element of the 34th Infantry Division. Initially assigned to the 2nd Brigade, 34th Infantry Division as an air assault infantry battalion, the unit was eventually reassigned to the 1st Brigade Combat Team, 34th Infantry Division.
