133rd Infantry 'Ironman Battalion' Receives Mobilization Orders

As part of the U.S. Army's ongoing overseas operational requirements, the 1st Battalion (Ironman), 133rd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 34th Infantry Division, Iowa Army National Guard, recently received deployment orders for Operation Spartan Shield in the U.S. Central Command (CENTCOM) Area of Responsibility (AOR).

This is the first of a number of deployments announced by Maj. Gen. Ben Corell, former 34th Infantry Division Commander, and current lowa National Guard Adjutant General, during his recent Condition of the Guard address to the lowa General Assembly.

The 133rd Infantry Battalion will deploy with approximately 550 Soldiers mobilizing from National Guard armories in seven lowa communities: Charles City, Davenport, Dubuque, Iowa City, Iowa Falls, Oelwein and Waterloo.

Their primary mission will involve area security and force protection operations in the CENTCOM AOR, which encompasses 27 countries including Afghanistan, Iraq, Kuwait, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, among others.

This is the fifth federal mobilization for the Ironman Battalion since 2000, including a nearly 22-month mobilization in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, (The Long Deployment), from September 2005 through August 2007. The battalion's most recent deployment was to Afghanistan in 2010.

The battalion is currently working to schedule send-off ceremonies, which will occur at the end of May. The Ironman Battalion will then travel to Ft. Bliss, Texas, to complete its final training and readiness checks before deploying overseas. The deployment is expected to last approximately one year.

IOWA 113th CAVALRY TROOPS RECEIVE MOBILIZATION ORDERS FOR AFRICA

As part of the U.S. Army's ongoing overseas operational requirements, Troop C, 1st Squadron, 113th Cavalry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 34th Infantry Division, Iowa Army National Guard, recently received deployment orders for Operation Enduring Freedom in the United States Africa Command (U.S. AFRICOM) (AOR). U.S. AFRICOM is responsible for U.S. military operations, exercises and security cooperation activities on the African continent, its island nations and surrounding waters.

Troop C, based in Le Mars, Iowa, will deploy with approximately 90 Soldiers. They will be joined by 40 Soldiers from Troop A, 1st Squadron, 113th Cavalry Regiment, assigned to the Freedom Center located on Camp Dodge in Johnson, Iowa.

This is the third federal mobilization for Troop C since 2001. The troop previously deployed to Iraq in 2005 and Afghanistan in 2010.

The 113th Calvary Troop will serve as part of a Task Force, with the 700 soldier, 2-135th Infantry Battalion, Minnesota National Guard, which improves security posture at U.S. installations and forward operating bases in the AFRICOM region, while maintaining a rapidly deployable force prepared to respond to crisis.

For the last four years, Troop C, along with several additional lowa Army National Guard units, has completed increasingly complicated training events in preparation for mobilization.

The troop is currently working to schedule send-off ceremonies, which will occur in June. They will travel to Ft. Bliss, Texas, to complete their final training and readiness checks before deploying overseas. The deployment is expected to last approximately one year.

WWII Combat Veteran and Published Author Dies

COL (Ret) Robert "Bob" Joseph Berens, 96, died peacefully surrounded by his family on Aug 16, 2019 at Greenspring Village, Springfield, VA.

Robert was born in Dunlap, IA and was mobilized with the 3rd Battalion,168th Infantry Regiment, 34th Infantry Division, as a 17 year old soldier, on 10 Feb, 1941. He served throughout the entire North Africa and Italian Campaign as an infantry soldier and earned a Battlefield Commission by the end of the war.

Bob stayed in the U.S. Army after the war, became an Airborne Soldier, and served a second round of infantry combat duty in Korea, where he was awarded the Combat Infantry Badge, 2nd Award. Robert continued his military service for our country, which brought him to his third combat tour in Vietnam prior to retirement in 1974.

Robert often stated that his toughest combat experience was the Italian Battle of Monte Cassino. He served 32 years, rising in rank from infantry recruit to full Colonel.

Robert was a Life Member of the 34th Infantry Ddivision Association.

During this time, he earned a Master's degree in Journalism from the University of Wisconsin. After retiring from the Army, he taught college-level written communications, wrote articles for professional military magazines and published one novel and four nonfiction books; "Second Time Around," Citizen Soldier- The Fighting Ed Bird, and "Limbo on the Yalu, plus a collection of his army combat experiences which were published in the Washington Post.

Robert graduated from the Iowa State University (BA) and married his college sweetheart Betty-Lou Ehlke. They were married over 59 years, traveling the world throughout their time together. Robert is survived by three daughters; 11 grandchildren; and forty-seven great-grandchildren.

He was interred at Arlington National Cemetery.

Obituary of Michael J. Musel

Michael J. Musel, the Secretary of the 34th Infantry Division Association passed away from this life, at age 74, on April 12th. He joined the US Army as an Iowa State University student, attended Engineer OCS at Ft Belvoir, VA and served 18 months of duty in Vietnam with six years of active duty. He later joined the Iowa National Guard and served in the 194th Field Artillery as well as the 185th Training Regiment, and the Iowa National Guard Joint Forces HQ's as a Operations, Personnel and Mobilization Officer. LTC Michael J. Musel retired from the Iowa National Guard with over 27 years of Active Duty and ARNG service.

Mike was a very proud member of the 34th Infantry Division Association. As Secretary he kept the organizations financial records and membership rooster with high standards. After his retirement from

the USDA, Mike started at the museum as a volunteer before he became a temporary employee in 2004 and then hired permanently in 2014. Mike was the museum historian and administrative assistant at the Iowa Gold Star Military Museum.

Mike's interest outside of the museum included being a member of the Ray Society. Mike was also a civil war history buff. He maintained a library with many books and papers on the Civil War, and was always willing to learn more.

Michael is survived by two sons and their families. After a private family service, Mike was buried, with full Military Honors, at St. Joseph's Cemetery in Chelsea, IA.





2-135th Inf BN at Camp Ripley - AT 2019

2019 was another busy year for the 135th Infantry, preparing for an upcoming deployment in the summer of 2020. Annual training for the Battalion focused on Platoon live fire exercises and integrating engineer and aviation assets.

Additionally the Battalion conducted an Exportable Combat Training Capability (XCTC) rotation and the main effort in the Brigade Culminating Force on Force mission at the Camp Ripley Combined Arms Collective Training Facility (CACTF). The Mankato based 2nd Battalion 135th Infantry Regiment (First Minnesota) is Commanded by LTC Charles "Chip" Rankin and CSM Benjamin Schieber.

Approximately 700 Soldiers from the 2nd Battalion, 135th Infantry are expected to deploy to the Horn of Africa this summer in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. They will serve as a Task Force, including approximately 130 Soldiers from C Troop, 1-113 CAV, which improves security posture at U.S. installations and forward operating bases in the AFRICOM region, while maintaining a rapidly deployable force prepared to respond to crisis.

This will be the 9th deployment for the Battalion, in whole or in part, since 2001. The last deployment for the Battalion was 2016-2017 to the Sinai Peninsula of Egypt as part of the Multination Force and Observers (MFO) mission.

During the BN's Annual Training this summer a BN Deployment ceremony is tentatively scheduled for 13JUN2020 at AASF#2 in Saint Cloud. Further information will be published through official authorities.

1-125th Field Artillery Trains at Fort Hood

The 1-125 Field Artillery Battalion conducted Exportable Combat Training Center (xCTC) at Fort Hood, Texas 2-22 August 2019 to validate Field Artillery mission essential tasks including conducting a comprehensive validated platoon live-fire range.

The lane consisting of major objectives such as: receiving the mission, conducting R3SP (refuel, refit, resupply and supply point) operations, day/night occupations, conducting a platoon defense and executing an assortment of fire missions. The platoon validation lane along with the execution of mission command, sustainment, medical and firesupport in direct support of the 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team was a lofty objective even under 17 days scheduled in the field.

Upon arrival, the battalion was tested with its first major task, the heat. Each day brought temperatures over 90 degrees and 100% humidity, and with a tight timeline for execution, the entire brigade felt like ants under a microscope just trying to move fast enough to meet the tasks-at-hand.

After a few days of constant heat and sweat the 1-125 FA got into a groove and began its field operation by tweaking the conduct of their lanes throughout the entire training met organizational expectations while also exceeding evaluations by our Active Duty evaluators from the 2-307th FA BN.

Overall the organization met all training objectives while operating safely in the roughest environment the battalion could have expected outside of the National Training Center (NTC). The battalion will utilize its little downtime during 2020 to prepare for its upcoming NTC rotation and will continue the Fire Support mission at Ft. Irwin.



The 1-125 FA: HQ's & HQ's Battery is located in New Ulm, A Battery in Pipestone & Luverne, B Battery in Jackson, C Battery in Fairmont, F Company in St. Peter and St. James and the Headquarters and HQ's Btry, Det in Anoka. The battalion fires the M109A6 Paladin, 155MM Howitzer, which has a range of approximately 30 Kilometers.

The official language of the region is French and Arabic. The U.S. Navy Expeditionary Base, known as Camp Lemonnier, is located in Djibouti. Approximately 4,500 U.S. troops are stationed in East Africa.

Maj Gen Jensen Nominated for Director of the Army Guard

Maj. Gen. Jon Jensen, who is currently serving as the Adjutant General of the Minnesota National Guard, is expected to be nominated to serve as the next director of the Army National Guard.

Jensen has served in the National Guard for 37 years and twice deployed to Iraq while serving with the 34th Infantry Division. He commanded the division prior to becoming his state's adjutant general in 2017.

"Those who know Major General Jensen are not surprised he's been picked for this top position," Walz said. "Not only has he served our state well, but he's worked with his colleagues across the country to build relationships and expand the partnership between NG forces and the federal government."

Pending confirmations, the Guard is expected to see new leaders at all four of the top positions at NGB later this year. They also include nominations for the next NGB vice chief and Air Guard director.

If nominated and confirmed, Jensen would replace Lt. Gen. Daniel Hokanson, who is awaiting confirmation to serve as the next chief of the NG Bureau. Leaders of the Senate Armed Services Committee have said they would likely delay confirmation hearings while they are focused on preparing the 2021 National Defense Authorization Act.
