Fifty years ago last February 10, 1991 the 34th Infantry Division was activated into Federal Service at Council Bluffs, Iowa, on February 10, 1941, and proceeded to Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, for training and subsequently to Fort Dix, New Jersey, Northern Ireland, Scotland, North Africa and Italy.

The 34th Infantry Division in World

War II had the distinction of being not only the first to land in the European Theatre, but also had more days in combat (over 600) than any other, and accredited with capturing more than 40,000 prisoners. The Division had 16,401 battle casualties. The 34th ranked second to none and stands high on the scroll of honor among the greatest fighting units that ever carried the Stars and Stripes into battle.
