SUBJECT: World War II 50th Anniversary

- 1. We will soon observe the mobilization of the 34th Infantry Division and the 113th Cavalry. The 113th Cavalry was activated on 13 January 1941 and was soon followed by the 34th Division on 10 February 1941. It is important that we recognize these two outstanding organizations and the soldiers who fought and many who gave their lives for our Nation. The Iowa National Guard will officially commemorate both of these anniversaries on 10 February 1991.
- 2. Several activities have already been coordinated and supported to commemorate these important events.
- a. A special edition of the <u>Iowa Militiaman</u> will be distributed during the third week of February 1991. Units and individuals desiring to provide items for publication should send history items to this office no later than 3 January 1991, and items pertaining to commemorative events no later than 13 February 1991.
- b. We are supporting a group of veterans who are working to have US Highway 34 redesignated the "34th Infantry Division Memorial Highway." This designation was originally made after the war, but the signs are gone as is most Iowan's memory of the organizations' valorous past.
- c. A ceremony is being planned at the state capitol rotunda which would include the signing of proclamations honoring the units called.
- 3. It is planned all Iowa Army National Guard units organize and conduct a muster day activity for the veterans who mobilized out of our cities and towns for World War II. Efforts should be made to find the original commander and make him part of the event as well as other former members. It would appear that a luncheon and ceremony which includes the unit mobilization order and roster for Guardsman, former Guardsman and their families are appropriate. Unit family day activities are encouraged for the day.
- 4. Community involvement is the key to a successful anniversary. As a result, efforts should be made to generate store front displays and other recognitions of local World War II unit and individual soldier reflections. The local media could be the vehicle that generates the patriotic reflections that these types of programs attempt to generate. Local veterans, veterans' group leaders and community leaders will probably be eager to put these displays together, if the local fulltime personnel contact them and get them going on the project.
